The season that "could have been..." First place (or a tie) was not unfamiliar territory for the Twins: 108 calendar days. After play, Tuesday, August 9th, the ballclub was tied for the AL Central Division top spot with a 57-52 record. However, from that point until the end of the year, the Twins won only 21 of their last 53 games, dropping them to third...On March 22, former Astros star Carlos Correa signed a three-year contract for over \$35 million dollars—including an opt out after one season. Correa was a welcome addition, slamming 22 homers and driving home 64. Byron Buxton, who led the team with 28 jacks, was unable to escape the injured list, again, making the line-up for just 92 games while nursing a chronic right knee condition which finally required season ending surgery. Versatile Luis Arraez captured the A. L. batting title, finishing seventh with 173 base hits and a .375 on-base percentage...Joe Ryan was the Twins only double-digit winning pitcher (13). His 151 strikeouts paced the pitching staff.
