"Welcome to American Family Field (nee Miller Park) where the Brewers play." They hit a lot of home runs during the year (219, 2nd N. L.) and the pitching staff racked up a truck-load of strikeouts (1,530, 3rd N. L.). The offense steam-rolled the hapless Pirates in Pittsburgh, July 1st, with 19 runs, 16 hits, and five homers off five Bucco pitchers. The final score was 19-2...The Brew Crew were contenders for the NL Central lead the entire season, mostly in second place on the heels of the Cardinals, but they did enjoy 81 playing dates in first (or tied), the last August 5th. Their largest advantage was 4 ½ games, May 26th; the largest deficit 9 ½ games, September 7th. The ballclub competed for a Wild Card spot in the playoffs until the third-to-last day of the season, finishing one game behind the Phillies for the last position. The 2017 season was the last year they had missed the post-season..."Rowdy" Tellez smacked the most home runs (35) and drove in 89. The RBI leader was Willy Adames (98) to go with his 31 circuit clouts. Hunter Renfroe didn't lack for power, joining his mates with 29 jacks and 72 RBL. Brandon Woodruff struck out 190 batters, leading the pitching corps with 13 wins. Corbin Burnes, the 2021 Cy Young recipient, won 12 games and punched out 243 opponents. Eric Lauer picked up 11 wins while collecting 157 K's. Somewhat of a surprise to prepare for the stretch run, elite closer Josh Hader was swapped to San Diego for four players (one a minor leaguer), August 1st. The prime acquisition was another closer, Taylor Rogers. Devin Williams was also utilized in the closer role during the year and seemed to flourish. He remarkably whiffed 96 batters in just over 60 innings pitched (14.2 per nine innings).
