The owners of the franchise and President Jon Daniels decided to throw caution to the wind over the 2021-22 off-season to establish a contending ballclub. Some \$500 million were spent to purchase highly coveted free agents Marcus Semien, Cory Seager and pitcher Jon Gray. They even signed aging outfielder Kole Calhoun to a contract of over \$5 million. Their strategy was a complete flop which cost Chris Woodward his managerial job, August 15th, with the team in third place of the West division, 12 games under .500 and 23 out of first place. Daniels was let go two days later. Other than the newcomers, the rest of the roster and the pitching never produced...Semien went from 45 homers and 102 RBI in '21 to 26 jacks and 83 RBI in '22. Seager improved to 33 home runs in '22 from 16 the previous year and bumped his RBI total from 57 to 83 in 2022. However, after hitting over .300 in '21, his batting average dropped 61 points. Gray, 7 wins and 7 losses in '22 about equaled his prior season in Colorado. Calhoun raised his homer output in '22 by seven and RBI total by 32, but his batting average dropped 39 points. Nate Lowe and wunderkind Adolis Garcia both launched 27 homers. Garcia's 101 RBI topped the team...Martin Perez returned to Texas after two seasons in Boston to lead the pitching staff with 12 wins and 169 strikeouts...In the A. L., the Rangers were 9th in batting (.239), 4th in homers (198) and 12th in ERA (4.22). They allowed the second-most walks in the league (581)...In one-run games and those that went to extra-innings, Texas was 18-37. Their record versus division foes was 31-45.
