The Twins led the American League with 233 home runs which included 15 individuals with totals between 24 and 11. Max Kepler cranked out the most and topped the ball club with 66 RBI. Joey Gallo and the normally light-hitting Michael A. Taylor followed with 21 each. Late free-agent signee Carlos Correa re-upped with the Twins and added 18 jacks and 65 RBI...A January trade with Miami brought #1 starter Pablo Lopez to strengthen the pitching staff. His 11 wins and 234 strikeouts were the staff's best. Joe Ryan also won 11 games and whiffed 197...The Twins hung around the AL Central lead all season, never being more than ½ game behind July 8-9. Minnesota hopped into first July 14th and crossed the wire with a 9-game cushion...They won their Wild Card series over Toronto in two straight games, snapping an 18 consecutive game losing streak in play-off contests dating to 2004. Houston ended the Twins season in the next round, 3 games to 1, as part of a best-of-five ALDS.
