The citizens of Cincinnati shared plenty of street-corner and office cubicle pleasantries with "How 'bout them Reds!" A twelve-game winning streak June 10th through June 23rd rocketed the Redlegs from third, four games out of the NL Central lead, to first by 1 ½ games. After dropping to second, the Reds claimed first once again by a half-game as late as August 2nd. The ballclub fell on tough times the remainder of the year, going 23-29 to the end of the season...The summer was sparked by a group of youngsters such as twenty-one year old infielder Elly De La Cruz who premiered June 6th at home with a third inning double in three at bats against the Dodgers. The next day he hit his first major league home run, a 458-foot shot. His superlative speed helped him swipe second, third, AND home in the same inning, July 8th, a first for a Reds player since 1919. Eight days later, the 6'5" shortstop set a Statcast record with a throwing assist of 97.9 mph. After hitting for the cycle, June 23rd, the prodigy went on to hit 13 homers in 98 games. Spencer Steer walloped 23 home runs and drove home 86 to lead the team. Infielder Matt McLain debuted May 23rd, playing in 89 games and pumping 16 jacks to go with 50 RBI. Will Benson (11 homers) and Christian Encarnacion-Strand (13 home runs) raised many eyebrows as well. The Reds 190 stolen bases led the big leagues...Closer Alexis Diaz had the most wins on the pitching staff (9) and was complimented by 23-year old starter Hunter Greene who won four and punched out 152 batters. Greene is still looked upon as a possible star. Andrew Abbott won eight times. Relievers posted 53 saves, the most in the majors.
