It doesn't take long for the sweet smell of a rose to fade and finally become indistinguishable. So was the case of Giants now-former manager Gabe Kapler. His ballclub won 107 games in 2021, finished at .500 in 2022, and after contending for the playoffs mid-season 2023 on the strength of a 10-game winning streak, paled into an also-ran in September, a month they won only 9 of 27 games. Kapler, a sometimes contentious personality, was let go with three games left in the season... The offense was the team's weakness--the lowest batting average in the National league, .235. Likewise, they were second-to-last with 674 runs scored...It clearly appeared "father time" and persistent injuries had caught up with Brandon Crawford, an integral part of the offense for 13 years as well as one of the slickest-fielding shortstops in baseball. His 2023 season ended with an anemic seven home runs and 38 RBI, his game slowed by leg ailments. The unassuming Wilmer Flores led the Giants with 23 homers while J. D. Davis's reliable bat contributed 18 jacks and team-high 69 RBI. Flores drove home 60 runs...Logan Webb, 11 wins, 194 strikeouts, received the second-most votes for the N. L. Cy Young Award. He tossed the most innings in the big leagues. Camilo Doval tied for the second most saves in the majors and struck out nearly 12 batters per nine innings pitched.
