An early season jaunt into first place of the AL West was foiled when injuries, oh those injuries, cut through the ballclub. Firstly, Mike Trout's hamate bone in his left wrist broke while swinging at a pitch July 3<sup>rd</sup> which required time on the injured list. His return to the line-up in August was abbreviated again after he experienced pain in the same wrist. Ultimately, he was listed on the I. L. a third time with his chronic back pain exacerbated by soreness in his right ribcage. In 82 games, he hit 18 homers and drove in 44. As Anthony Rendon battled back from injury, his replacement, Gio Urshela, lost time with a fractured pelvis in June. On July 29<sup>th</sup>, Taylor Ward was hit in the head by a pitched ball resulting in facial fractures. The Angels spent much of the season churning the roster to get healthy people on the field...Fortunately, A. L. MVP Shohei Ohtani was available almost every day. His remarkable season consisted of 44 home runs, 95 RBI, and 102 runs scored. On the pitching mound, he won 10 ten games and struck out 167. The gifted one led the A. L. in homers, and posted the best slugging percentage (.654) and OPS (1.066) in the majors. Brandon Drury was second on the Halos with 26 jacks and 83 RBI...June 24<sup>th</sup>, the Angels annihilated the Rockies, 25-1, while outscoring them 32-12 in a three-game series. Colorado won two of those games. An August/September swoon (16-38) likely cost skipper Phil Nevin his job.
