The Cardinals, one of the most storied and successful franchises in baseball history, do not finish at the bottom of the standings very often. At the beginning of their 142<sup>nd</sup> season, during baseball's "modern era," the Redbirds have won 11 World Championships, 23 National League pennants, and made the post-season 32 times. They were NL Central champs in 2022. Since 1901, they had finished last six years: 1903, 1907, 1908, 1913, 1918, and 1990. Miller Huggins, who later managed the great Yankee teams of the 1920s, was the skipper of that 1913 ballclub. In his career as a Cardinals player (1910-1916), the diminutive 5' 6" Huggins played second base and hit .265 for his career. He joined the Yanks in 1918...The 2023 campaign turned into a real clunker for the Cards. Perhaps the absence of legends Albert Pujols and Yadier Molina put them in a funk. Forty-one year old stalwart Adam Wainwright could muster only five wins. There was also a mid-season dust-up between catcher Willson Contreras and the pitchers about communication breakdowns, as reported...A promising May saw 15 wins, but losing 15 of 23 games in June led to mediocrity...Ten players reached double-digits in homers. Young stud Nolan Gorman, 23, produced 27 home runs and 76 RBI. Nolan Arenado led the ballclub in runs batted in (93) and bashed 26 round-trippers. Paul Goldschmidt had a solid year: 25 homers and 80 RBI. Lars Nootbaar, 25, earned a full-time position while rookie Jordan Walker, 21, contributed 16 home runs and 51 RBI...The pitching staff was anchored by Miles Mikolas whose nine wins and 137 strikeouts in a whopping 35 starts led the way
