Coming off a playoff appearance in 2022 and with the addition of top-of-the line shortstop Xander Bogaerts, a free agent signing, a full season from the highly-sought after Juan Soto, and the return of ultra-talented Fernando Tatis, Jr., the 2023 campaign seemed to promise much more excitement and success for the Padres "nine." A run deep into the post-season did not appear likely as the ballclub got off to an unexpected limp start to the season. At the All Star break, the team was in fourth place 8 ½ games out in the NL West. Winning only 10 of 28 games in August took away any playoff hopes; a 19-7 record in September would not nearly be enough to get back in the race...Soto led the big leagues with 132 walks and placed high among major league leaders in RBI (109, tied for 4th); on-base percentage (.410, 3rd); and OPS (.930, 9th). He clobbered 35 homers. Manny Machado had 30 jacks along with 91 RBI. Tatis Jr. added 25 home runs and 78 RBI while playing superior defense in his new right field beat. Ha-seong Kim finished seventh in the majors in stolen bases while newcomer Bogaerts produced 19 homers and 58 RBI...NL Cy Young winner Blake Snell was better than all the rest in the big leagues with his 2.25 ERA as well as hits allowed per nine innings pitched (5.75). Snell also tied for third in strikeouts (234) and finished second in the majors with 11.7 K's per nine innings. Snell and fellow starter Michael Wacha both won fourteen ballgames. Wacha lost four games for a .778 winning percentage, MLB's third best mark. Joe Musgrove dealt with injury during the season (broken toe, inflamed right shoulder) but still won ten games, dropping three. Musgrove fired the fastest pitch (86 mph) in the coldest environment ever in Antarctica, December 2022, to support a disabled athletes foundation.
