The M's departed on their season's odyssey back-in-the-pack; however, the months of July (17-9) and August (21-6) placed them right in the thick of the AL West race. The year really came down to the month of September with match-ups against their closest competition: Houston and Texas. Seattle entered the final month tied for first with the Rangers against whom the Mariners were 4-9 for the season, 2-4 in September (1-2 vs. Houston). What's ironic, the M's had a much better overall record for the month (32-13). Texas was 30-25, Houston 29-25...At the end of the year, Seattle had finished third behind Texas and one game out of making the playoffs...Twenty-two year old Julio Rodriguez had as good a season as his Rookie of the Year run in 2023. He led the ballclub with 32 jacks and 103 RBI. Eugenio Suarez's homer total dropped by nine from 2022, but he accounted for 96 RBI. Cal Raleigh belted 30 home runs; Teoscar Hernandez hit 26 homers and drove in 93...The pitching staff posted the league's best ERA (3.74) and allowed the fewest walks (421). Luis Castillo was the staff's biggest winner (14) while striking out 219. George Kirby had the best strikeout ratio per nine innings pitched in the majors (9.053). Marco Gonzales was gone for the year on August 13th due to left foreman tightness and subsequent surgery. He won four games in ten starts.
