The *Brewers* finished the year 12th in both National League batting (.240) and home runs (165). The stick of Willy Adames led the ballclub after producing 24 homers and 80 RBI. Backstop William Contreras was next with 78 runs batted in while contributing 17 home runs and a team-high 38 doubles. Christian Yelich was able to stay injury-free for most of the year, playing in 144 games and popping 19 jacks, driving in 76 runs and leading the Brew Crew with 106 runs scored...The pitching staff garnered the league's best ERA (3.71). Freddy Peralta who won the most games (12) posted the staff's highest strikeout total (210) and the big leagues' fourth best strikeout ratio per nine innings pitched (11.408). Corbin Burnes was a 10-game winner, including the league's lowest WHIP for starters (1.069). Closer Devin Williams tied for the fifth-most saves in the majors and showed a flashy ratio of 13.3 K's per 9 innings. Brandon Woodruff went down with right shoulder miseries after two starts, came back in August, then underwent surgery October 13th...The *Brewers*, who won the NL Central for the third time in six years, were top dogs of the division for most of the season. As many as 22 games over .500 the season's final day, they held a nine-game lead on second place Chicago...In the playoffs for the fifth time in six years, the *Brewers* were swept in their Wild Card series, 2-0, at home by Arizona. Manager Craig Counsell, a free agent at the end of the season, signed a contract to pilot the Cubs starting in 2024 for five years and \$40 million. He had been strongly rumored to be headed for the Mets.
