The D-Backs went into the season given a 1.64% chance of becoming N. L. champions and a .79% percent chance to win the World Series (#23 of 30 teams) according to some odds-makers. All this ballclub did was open the eyes of the baseball world with their power and speed. Tied for first at the end of April, the playoffs later appeared to be a real possibility: the D-Backs were solely in first place from June 6<sup>th</sup> through July 8<sup>th</sup>. In a first place tie with Los Angeles at the All Star break, they would hover around second or third the rest of the season, clinching a Wild Card spot September 30<sup>th</sup> and finishing 16 games behind...They swept and upset the Brewers in their Wild Card series AND blasted the Dodgers in a NLDS to meet the Phillies for the league title. It took seven games to beat the Phils (the last two games in Philly) and reach the Fall Classic for the first time since 2001. Arizona fell to equally surprising Texas in five games, mainly because the bullpen could not get the Rangers out at critical times...Ace Zac Gallen was second in the big leagues with 17 wins and third in Cy Young voting. His total of 220 strikeouts was sixth highest in the majors...Christian Walker had a marvelous season, leading the team with 34 homers, 103 RBI and 36 doubles. He was followed by Ketel Marte's 25 jacks. N. L. Rookie of the Year Corbin Carroll burst brightly on the major league scene with the third most stolen bases and second most triples (10), adding superb defense and a bat that struck 25 home runs. Rookie catcher Gabriel Moreno won the starting job outright. He led the majors throwing out 39% of attempted base stealers and swung a highly productive bat...After four horrible starts, Madison Bumgarner was released in April.
