Will they stay or will they go? Las Vegas extended a hand to help move the team to "Sin City" by offering a brand new ballpark. The city of Oakland has discussed about building a new playground for the A's for an eternity. What's it gonna be? Who KNOWS? A hearty group of fans made their feelings known during the season by holding signs demanding the owner, John Fisher, to sell the franchise to someone who would keep their team in the Bay Area...On the diamond, the A's lost ten more games than the year before. What is worse, they tied the major league record for the worst start to a season (10-45) with the 1904 Senators and the 1899 Cleveland Spiders. With a record of 21-60 half way through the year, they were sometimes on pace to lose more games than the 1962 Mets, who lost 120 (modern era). The A's won 29 games in the second half to avoid the dubious honor...The team's only All Star, Brent Rooker, the primary DH, led the team in homers (30) and RBI (69). JP Sears and Shintaro Fujinami could boast the most wins (5). Sears had the most strikeouts (161).
