The Braves had the best record in the majors and there a lot of reasons why: #1 team batting average (.276), #1 runs scored (947), #1 hits (1,543), and #1 home runs (307) to tie the 2019 Twins for the most in a season. The Dodgers were second with 249 homers. Ronald Acuna, Jr. was ALL WORLD in stolen bases (#1) and among the top four in batting average, OBP (.416), slugging percentage (.596), and OPS (1.012). He also led the big leagues with 149 runs scored and 217 hits. His home run total (41) was fifth highest. Add to that the N. L. MVP Award. Matt Olson's 54 homers and 139 RBI topped the major leagues. His OPS (.993) came in fourth. Ozzie Albies hit 33 jacks and tied for fourth in the majors with 109 RBI. Austin Riley swung a potent war club as well: Toss his 37 home runs and 97 RBI into the mix, including Marcell Ozuna's 40 HRs and 100 RBI...Not to be out-shined by the offense, the Braves pitching staff owns ace Spencer Strider who led the big leagues with 20 wins and 281 strikeouts (13.548 per 9 innings pitched). He allowed only seven hits per nine innings. Charlie Morton won 14 ballgames while striking out 183. The staff alone whiffed 1,515 batters (highest in the league) but finished seventh in the N. L. with a 4.14 ERA... Going into the playoffs, Atlanta was a huge favorite to reach the World Series. They bowed out in a NLDS series to the Phillies for the second straight year in four games after winning the NL East by a dominating fourteen ahead of the Phils.
