A season which saw the O's win 100 games or more for the first time since 1980, and first playoff appearance since 2016, made Camden Yards a loud, vibrant, exciting place once again. Brandon Hyde was the right skipper at the right time for a young ballclub that was an 89-game winner in 2022. After July 22nd, first place belonged to the Orioles (except for a one-day tie mid-September). Their largest lead was a modest four games, September 9th. The O's record against their closest pursuers: Tampa Bay, Toronto, and the Yankees was 25-14. Earning a bye to an American League Division series against the red-hot Texas Rangers, the Orioles starting staff was shot full of holes in three straight games. Oriole starters were tattooed to the tune of a 14.63 ERA over eight innings pitched. The overall staff ERA was better than seven. At the plate, Jorge Mateo hit .800 with two doubles; 22-year-old Gunnar Henderson hit .500 and a homer in the series. Henderson, the AL Rookie of the Year, tied Anthony Santander for the team home run lead (28). Santander had the most RBI (95). Runner-up for Rookie of the Year, lead-off man Adley Rutschman, blasted 20 homers, knocked in 80, and picked up a Gold Glove. Henderson added 82 RBI. The normally light-hitting Ryan O'Hearn was a revelation: batting average high .280s, 14 jacks and 60 RBI. Signed as a free-agent in the off-season, Kyle Gibson took charge of the pitching staff with a 15-win season. Dean Kremer won 13 while up-and-comer Kyle Bradish won 12. Talented starter John Means, who went down with Tommy John surgery in May 2022, returned in September, winning his first game in two years, September 23rd against Cleveland. Closer Felix Bautista posted an off-the-chart 16.2 strikeouts per nine innings pitched. Richly rewarded for his dugout leadership, Hyde was named AL Manager of the Year.
