The Rays looked like world-beaters starting the season with a 13-game winning streak and holding sole possession of first place in the AL East until July 18th. Their biggest lead was 6 ½ games, July 1st. Two days later, they fell to second where they would remain the rest of the year, never more than four games out. Tampa played in the post-season for the fifth straight year, but were soundly eliminated by Texas in a ALDS match-up. In the series, the Rays hit .215 (no homers) and allowed five earned runs per game. Outscoring Tampa, 11-1, Texas hit .293 during a best-of-five two-game sweep...Former Phillie Zach Eflin posted a career-high 16 wins, tied for third best in the big leagues. He led the pitching staff with 186 K's. Shane McClanahan won 11 of 13 decisions; Tyler Glasnow won 10 games...The Rays finished second in the league in batting (.260) and fourth in home runs (230). They swiped 160 bases (2nd in the A. L.)...Ten Rays hit 11 or more homers: Isaac Paredes bashed 31 to lead the ballclub; his 98 RBI were the team high. Yandy Diaz put up the highest league batting average (.330). His .410 on-base percentage was the majors' fourth highest while his .932 OPS was eighth. Diaz added 22 home runs and 78 RBI. Jose Siri cracked 25 jacks. Randy Arozarena (23 HRs) tied Josh Lowe (20) with 83 RBI.
