Hank Bauer's flock went into the All Star break in first place by three games, twenty over .500. In fact, the Birds solely occupied or were tied for first a total of 92 scheduled days during the year. Their largest margin on the Yankees and/or White Sox (their closest pursuers) was 4 ½ games, June 29<sup>th</sup>. They entered July, August, and September in the top spot. They relinquished the lead on September 20<sup>th</sup> following a double-header split with the Angels at home. Winning seven of their final ten games wasn't enough to finish ahead of New York or Chicago; the O's had to settle for third just two games out. Over that same span beginning September 20<sup>th</sup>, the A. L. champion Yankees were 10-4, the White Sox 9-1...At the tender age of 19, one of the Orioles well-advertised "Baby Birds" anointed by the sportswriters, Wally Bunker finished second in league Rookie of the Year voting, won 19 ballgames, and tied the Dodgers "Sandy" Koufax for the big leagues best winning percentage (.792). His WHIP (1.042) was eighth best in the majors. Milt Pappas was a 16-game winner while thirty-eight-year old Robin Roberts won 13. Closer Stu Miller ended the year with the fourth most saves in MLB... Another youngster, outfielder John "Boog" Powell, 22, had lightning in his bat all season long: He ranked third in the majors with 39 homers, second in slugging percentage (.606) and OPS (1.005). He was second on the team with 99 RBI. Premier third-sacker Brooks Robinson topped the A. L. with 118 RBI. Robinson, the A. L. MVP, smacked 28 homers and was followed by Sam Bowens' 22. Luis Aparicio led the big leagues in stolen bases and was awarded his sixth Gold Glove.
