Baseball analysts regularly say that pennant races usually take shape by May 31<sup>st</sup>. On that date, the Tribe was in eighth place, 9 ½ games behind. The closest they came to the American League lead was June 18<sup>th</sup> with the ball club now third, three games back. This was during a stretch as the Indians completed a 23-14 month. At the All Star break they had dropped to sixth, 7 ½ games in arrears...Max Alvis's 22 homers, 67 RBI, and 32 doubles were tops on the ball club. Fred Whitfield followed with 21 jacks...The pitching staff struck out the most opponents in the A. L. (1,018). "Mudcat" Grant and Jack Kralick (acquired in a trade with the Twins for Jim Perry) tallied the most wins (13). Pedro Ramos led the staff with 169 K's...Hall of Famer Early Wynn, 43 years old, rapped up a 23-year career gaining his final win (#300) wearing Indians livery. His first victory was earned as a Washington Senator in 1941. He won 20 or more games five times in his career.
