To look with a sharp eye at manager Brian Snitker in the Braves dugout, one would think the man lives 24/7 with a poker face. Underneath that sleepy façade is a heck of a field boss. When he loses three of his top players to season-ending injury, any man would insightfully have to know what kind of talent and personalities he had on his team. For the record, Spencer Strider, after his second start, complained of soreness in his pitching arm. An MRI revealed interior damage in his elbow. Surgery ended his season. Next came Ronald Acuna Jr. who felt something wasn't right with his left knee taking a lead off second, May 26th. Saying the knee felt painfully sore, an MRI showed torn ligaments, similar to his right knee breakdown two years earlier. Finally, August 18th, Austin Riley's right hand was broken by a pitched ball, an early end to his year. The Braves have a penchant for finding replacement players who come in and play better than expected--namely Jorge Soler, Ramon Laureano, and Gio Urshela. The front office also took a flyer on Chris Sale who seemed to be battling a variety of injuries forever. Sale's season was prolific! He tied the Tigers Tarik Skubal for the major league lead in wins (18) as he posted the best ERA (2.38) and strikeouts per nine innings (11.4). His line: 225 K's, a mere 39 walks and the Pitcher's Triple Crown. Closer Raisel Iglesias tied for fifth in saves across MLB. Marcell Ozuna had a career year off a 39 home run 104 RBI *healthy* campaign. His batting average was fifth-best in the big leagues. Matt Olson got off to an uncharacteristically horrific start, but hacked his way through the second half to end up hitting 29 jacks, tallying 98 RBI, and almost flawlessly playing first base. Ozzie Albies added ten home runs and 53 RBI in 110 games. Riley's stats included 19 homers and 56 RBI. Acuna Jr. stole 16 bases in 49 games, reaching a franchise record 190th since the team moved to Atlanta. The Braves did not bring home to their teepee a seventh straight NL East title; however, they qualified for the playoffs the last day of the season, splitting a doubleheader with the Mets. San Diego appeared on the horizon to challenge the Braves in a best-of-three Wild Card series. The Padres outscored Atlanta 9-4, all the former needed to sweep the Braves from the playoffs. Sale was unavailable for the series, idled by back spasms.
