By the All Star break, the Reds were in fourth place, eight games out of first. Thus, they became sellers at the trade deadline, July 31st, moving Frankie Montas and Lucas Sims to the Red Sox and Brewers, respectively. They received little of value in return. An 8-6 start to the month of August lifted the team to second place of the Central Division but 10 games behind. The Reds never threatened for a Wild Card spot in the playoffs...Manager David Bell was fired, September 22nd, after the team's final home game. In five-plus years, his teams won 409 games, lost 456, and qualified for the post-season one time in 2020...Wunderkind Elly De La Cruz led the ball club with 25 homers and the major leagues in stolen bases. He scored 105 runs and knocked in 76. Spencer Steer (20 HRs) had the most RBI (92)...The most wins from the pitching staff came from the arms of Andrew Abbott and Nick Martinez (10). Hunter Greene (169 K's) took a big step forward in his still-morphing young career. His excellent ERA did not qualify for one of the best in the big leagues due to the lack of enough innings pitched (162). Alexis Diaz finished among the majors' top ten closers in saves.
