One has to check the history books to discover that the A's franchise was born in Philadelphia in 1901 under the leadership of Connie Mack. Some of the best teams in the early third of the 20th century and baseball history came out of their home, Shibe Park. With bad teams and faltering attendance, the franchise was sold and moved to Kansas City in 1954 followed by a relocation to Oakland in 1967. More great A's teams were to come in the early 70s then again from 1988-1990. Even when the team won championships in Oakland, attendance remained lackluster at best. The 2024 season was the final one in Oakland, ending a mediocre run for the last 20-plus years...This final edition will take some power and good pitching to Sacramento and eventually Las Vegas. (That's the plan.) Brent Rooker's bat accounted for 39 homers and 112 RBI, the highest numbers on the A's. Shea Langeliers followed with 29 round-trippers while JJ Bleday blossomed into a 20-homer man with the sixth-most doubles in the big leagues (43)...The pitching staff is a work-in-progress. Namely, JP Sears' 11 wins led the mound corps as well as his 137 strikeouts. A bushel of hard-throwers dots the list of relievers. Mason Miller, 25, was among major-league leaders in saves. He posted 104 K's. Part-time starters Oswaldo Bido (63) and Joe Boyle (56) struck out more than their number of innings pitched. Add Tyler Ferguson and Austin Adams to that group of fire-ballers.
