By the end of May, one could say the Nats were out of the pennant race in the NL East: third place, 13 games below .500. The closest they would come to the top would be 12-games out as late as June 21st one game under .500 and third. They played out the remainder of the year from that point at 34-53. Versus division foes they finished 25-27...Twenty-three-year old shortstop CJ Abrams (complete name is Paul Christopher Abrams Jr.) was selected to his first All Star team. In 138 games he hit 20 homers and drove in 65 runs. His home run count would turn out to be the best on the team. Abrams was sent to the low minors, September 20th, after breaking team rules while staying out late (8 am, Sept. 20) for a 1:20 pm ballgame that day. Luis Garcia played nearly every day, hitting 18 homers and leading the team in RBI (70). The Nats batted a respectable .243; however, on the base paths, they presented a track-and-field sprint team. Nationals' base runners swiped 223 bases to lead the majors. Topping the list was young outfielder Jacob Young's 33 followed by Abrams' 31. James Wood, 21, was summoned from the minors to debut July 1st and promptly singled that day for his first big league hit. He impressed with 9 homers, 41 RBI, and 14 stolen bases...The pitching staff had two ten-game winners: Jake Irvin and MacKenzie Gore. The latter rang-up the most strikeouts (181). Closer Kyle Finnegan ended the year with the 3rd most saves in MLB.
