The Phils, for much of the season, could boast they owned the best record in the big leagues. The ball club, after an unimpressive start and a team highly considered to be World Series bound, found its mojo. For the remainder of the year, the Braves (battered by injuries to three prime players who would not return for the stretch run), and the Mets (regenerated after an early season slumber to take on the chase in late May), breathlessly tried to stay on the heels of the Phillies. However, the season could be summed up with the phrase "It wasn't supposed to end this way." The NL East champions enjoyed a bye from the Wild Card round, then faced off with those pesky Mets. The best of five series went to the Metropolitans in four games. The Phils fell short in Game 1 but took Game 2 before the division series shifted to New York. In Game 3, Mets starter Sean Manaea stifled the Phils for a 7-2 win. Then four Mets pitchers silenced the Phillies to win Game 4, 4-1. Philadelphia hit a meager .186 to the Mets .269. One of the Phils three home runs was struck by Bryce Harper who hit .333. Nick Castellanos also homered and hit .412. Kyle Schwarber had only two hits, one of which was a homer for a .125 batting average. Ace Zack Wheeler started Game 1, allowing only one hit and zero runs in seven innings before being relieved, reaching his max pitch count. The Mets raked the Phillies mound staff after that for nearly six runs per ballgame, seven homers, and 35 base hits...During the regular season, Schwarber clouted 38 home runs and drove home 104 from his leadoff spot. Alec Bohm totaled 44 doubles and knocked in 97. Harper slashed 42 doubles and rocketed 30 baseballs out of the park. He finished with 87 RBI. Trea Turner contributed 21 jacks...Wheeler was one of the best pitchers in the game off a year with the third-best ERA in the Big Show (including a .955 WHIP), a 16-7 won/loss record and 224 strikeouts. Three other members of the mound staff brought home 37 victories: Aaron Nola (14), Ranger Suarez (12), and Cristopher Sanchez (11). The staff allowed the second fewest walks in the National League (444).
