The "Brew Crew" carried the NL Central division atop the standings for nearly the entire season, winning the division for the second consecutive year and third in four. Pat Murphy, with a thick catalogue of baseball leadership experience collegiately and in the pros (he won four National Championships at Arizona State) led the team through a smooth transition when long-time manager Craig Counsell decided the Cubs should be his next stop. Murphy's charges got a big jump-start, winning 55 of their first 97 games. Their largest lead at any time was 11 ½ games, August 20th...Willy Adames paced the ball club with 32 homers and 112 RBI. William Contreras split time behind the plate and as the DH, contributing career highs in home runs (23) and RBI (92). Twenty-year-old Jackson Chourio brought top-flight major league skills from the start with 21 homers, 79 RBI, and Gold Glove style fielding. Rhys Hoskins' 26 jacks and 82 RBI were very welcome. Christian Yelich's problematic back allowed him to play in 73 games. He hit 11 home runs and drove in 42 before his then-stellar season was curtailed with back surgery in mid-August...Colin Rea (12) and Freddy Peralta (11) were the biggest winners on the pitching staff. The other starters and the relief corps were a solid group as well--Milwaukee had the second-best ERA in the National League (3.62)...A team which has won 90-plus games four of the last eight years fell into the Wild Card tournament, opposing the surprising Mets in a best-of-three set according to their seeding. Rookie Chourio was up to the task. He hit .455 and two home runs. The two teams split the first two games, then played a scoreless standoff through six innings of Game 3. Milwaukee sent two runs across the plate in the seventh for a 2-0 lead; however, the Mets worked their late inning magic as they had all year, scoring four runs off closer Devin Williams in the top of the ninth, runs the Brewers couldn't answer.
