The season came down to this for the defending National League champions: Leading for the top Wild Card spot with a seven-game edge the last week of August, the Diamondbacks played no better than .500 baseball in September as a host of teams closed in. Their playoff destiny would be determined by the Mets and Braves who were scheduled to play a make-up doubleheader in Atlanta, September 30<sup>th</sup>. For Arizona to make it into the post-season, either New York or Atlanta had to sweep the twin-bill. The pair split the games leaving the D-Backs on the outside looking in. In the season's first half, the "Snakes" finished one game over .500. The second half saw them win 27 of 39 games to stay hot in the post-season race before fading in the final month. They split ten games against San Diego and Milwaukee in September, the teams who claimed the #1 and #2 spots, respectively...The D-Backs tied the Pirates for the majors' highest batting average (.263), finishing third in the league with 211 homers. Ketel Marte and Eugenio Suarez both reached the 30 homer mark: Marte (36), Suarez (30). Suarez topped Marte in RBI 101 to 95. Rookie of the Year for 2023, Corbin Carroll, finished with another "triple double" but his batting average for '24 was 54 points less than it had been in '23. His 14 triples tied Boston's Jarred Duran for the most in the big leagues...The pitching staff's 4.62 ERA was near the bottom of the N. L. (13<sup>th</sup>); however, Zac Gallen shined bright with 14 wins. Brandon Pfaadt won 11, leading the staff with 185 K's.
