Mets rookie manager Carlos Mendoza was as even-keeled as a first time major league skipper could be. He needed to be in a huge way. A team projected as a long-shot to the post-season did not get off to an auspicious start. Below average hitting from the team's major players was the sorest spot. Pete Alonso (34 HRs, 88 RBI), Francisco Lindor (33 HRs, 91 RBI), Jeff McNeil, Brandon Nimmo, and new arrival J. D. Martinez all started the year well below expectations..The pitching staff, particularly the starters, worked hard all season long, keeping the Mets in games they would miraculously come from behind to win. Luis Severino (11 wins, 161 K's) and Sean Manaea (12 wins, 184 K's) were revelations and healthy all year. Jose Quintana added 10 victories while previous "question mark" David Peterson solidified himself in the rotation, finishing the campaign with 10 wins, three losses, and an ERA under 3.00. At times, all four were dominating..Frustrated with an embarrassing 22-33 record, following a team meeting orchestrated by Lindor, the Mets turned their season around. They played .626 baseball (67-40) from May 30th to the end of the regular season. Included was a 9-game winning streak from late August into early September..At the end of May, Jose Iglesias, who was playing at Triple A with a minor league contract, was recalled. His hot bat from the get-go and Lindor's move to lead-off propelled the offense on the track to a remarkable season. With a win on the last day (coming from behind), the first game of a make-up doubleheader in Atlanta, the Mets slipped into the playoffs and a Wild Card match-up with Milwaukee. Pete Alonso's three-run homer in the top of the ninth inning of Game 3 (best-of-three) rocketed the ball club into an NLDS collision with the Phillies..New York then eliminated the highly favored Phils, 3-1, to win the best-of-five series..The Mets bats became silent. Their pitching became very hittable, as the Dodgers, with a stacked line-up and outstanding mound-work, overwhelmed the Mets in their NLCS, four games to two. Still, 2024 was a season Mets fans returned loud and rowdy to Citi Field.
