The Tigers clawed their way into the post-season following a bad start which extended into August. On that month's second day, they had hit their low point--16 games out of first in fourth place of the AL Central. From August 3rd to the end of the season, Detroit played off-the-chart baseball (34-17, .667), briskly tracking down the opposition from a one-time 10-game deficit for a Wild Card spot to capturing the final position to reach the play-offs. Their dizzying streak continued as they ambushed the Astros in Houston in a best-of-three series, quickly disposing the Astros in two games...The Tigers and Guardians traded victories through the first four games of their best-of-five ALDS; however, Detroit could not overcome a 6-3 Cleveland lead going into the eighth of Game 5, an eventual 7-3 loss. The Guardians pitching staff tamed the Tigers' offense, holding them to a .214 batting average and two home runs. Detroit's pitching, for its part, shutout Cleveland in two of the five games. In two starts, Tarik Skubal struck out 14 in 13 innings, but took the loss in Game 5 after allowing five runs in six innings...Skubal's 18 wins tied Atlanta's Chris Sale for the most in the big leagues. He lost only four games and topped the majors in strikeouts (228). His ERA was the lowest in the A. L... All Star Riley Greene paced the offense with 24 homers and 74 RBI. Kerry Carpenter and Matt Vierling were next with 18 and 16 home runs, respectively. Both produced 57 RBI...Manager A. J. Hinch and Javier Baez had their differences over Baez's apparent lack of hustle (Baez was having a poor season at the plate), resulting in his being benched. In late August, after contributing six home runs and 37 RBI, Baez left the team for the final month and had hip surgery. Spencer Torkelson disappointed with only 10 homers and 37 RBI in 92 games.
