The Guardians charged out of the starting gate and didn't look back. Rookie manager Stephen Vogt's ball club was up by seven games in the AL Central with 52 wins by the mid-way point. Kansas City's 50-32 second half run, starting with Game 82, tied them with the Guardians for first, August 27th, after the regenerated Royals won the first three games of a four-game set in Cleveland. The Guardians (who were 12-17 for the month), won the fourth game, a big boost to regaining their mojo to lead both Kansas City and Detroit by 6 ½ games by the end of the year. Detroit launched a winning stretch of their own in September (17-8) to capture a Wild Card spot along with the Royals. In the end, the Guardians opposed the Tigers in one of the league's division series. The best-of-five was 2-2 until Cleveland held on to eliminate Detroit, 7-3, in Game 5...In the ALCS, the Yankees out-slugged the Guardians ten home runs to five. The decisive fifth game went 10 innings, a 5-2 win for New York after Guardians pitchers gave up three runs in the top of the frame, a deficit they could not overcome...Jose Ramirez's potent war club produced 39 homers, 39 doubles, and 118 RBI. Josh Naylor had a season with 31 jacks and 108 RBI. Second year shortstop Brayan Rocchio opened some eyes batting .333 in the post-season...Cleveland's pitching staff was among the league's best: 3.61 ERA (2nd). Tanner Bibee and Ben Lively teamed for 25 wins while the supercharged arm of Emmanuel Clase led the A. L. in saves. The staff still showed a lot of grit with the loss of Shane Bieber in the season's first month and a closely guarded year concerning Triston McKenzie's injury-filled 2023 season. Matthew Boyd (former Tiger) and Alex Cobb (Giants), added to the staff for the stretch run, couldn't replace their co-horts. Boyd, signed as a free agent at the end of June went 2-2 with 46 K's and a sub-3.00 ERA. Cobb on the other hand, was acquired via trade with the Giants at the trade deadline. He made three starts (one additional in the post-season) winning two games during the regular season over 16 innings and posting a sub-3.00 ERA. Dealing with shoulder inflammation in his pitching arm (right), he pitched a perfect game into the seventh inning against Pittsburgh, September 1st..."Bo" Naylor is graced with the full name of Noah-Gibson James Washington Naylor.
