The M's were a first-place team for 107 calendar days, ending the months of April, May, June, and July in the top spot of the AL West division. (They were tied for first with Houston on July 31st.) What's more, the Mariners had a lead as large as ten games, June 18th. By mid-August, the ball club's season was on the skids. A 7-11 start to August, including giving up 15 runs in a game the 13th in Detroit after the M's had scored 12 the day before, cost manager Scott Servais his job on the 22nd. Servais' Mariners teams had won 680 games since he was hired as skipper for the 2016 season. With only one playoff appearance during that time, coupled with 2024's slide, upper management felt a change had to be made. Former catcher Dan Wilson was promoted from his job as the organization's roving catching instructor to replace Servais. Wilson managed to guide Seattle to 21 wins in their last 34 games which was enough to finish one game out of the last Wild Card spot. They were eliminated from a shot at the post-season tournament, September 27th, when they were second in the division and four games out of the lead...Cal Raleigh, one of the best defensive catchers in MLB, whacked opposing pitchers for 34 homers and 100 RBI, both team highs. Julio Rodriguez followed with 20 jacks and 68 RBI...The M's pitching corps finished with the A. L.'s lowest ERA (3.49). The starters, averaging 26 years of age, won 69 percent of the Mariners victories. George Kirby won 14 games; Bryce Miller was a 12-game winner; while the staff's elder statesman, Luis Castillo, 31, tallied 11. Logan Gilbert (9-12) posted the most strikeouts (220). Kirby, Miller and Castillo combined for 525 K's in 546.2 innings pitched.
