Early in the season, manager "Skip" Schumaker, who had directed the Marlins to a Wild Card spot the season before, declared he would not return to the ball club at the end of his contract in September. Prior to and at the trading deadline, the Fish moved a host players via trade or release, including the dazzling and entertaining "Jazz" Chisholm to the Yankees. Batting champion Luis Arraez was dispatched to San Diego in May. Notably they would be followed by Josh Bell, Bryan De La Cruz, Trevor Rogers and Tanner Scott, mostly for minor league prospects...At the end of April, the Marlins were entrenched in last place of the NL East with seven wins in 31 games, 13 ½ games from first. The rest of the year didn't get much better. Under water after Game 81, Miami were 23 under .500, 25 games in arrears...Jake Burger carried the mantle for the ball club, hitting 29 homers and driving home 76. Xavier Edwards' lofty batting average did not come with enough official at bats to place high among his peers...Scott's six wins prior to his departure to the Padres were the most on the pitching staff.
