The season turned out to be a shoot-out between the O's and Yankees for the AL East flag. Baltimore was up by one game at the end of April, led by two at May's end, then tied with the Yanks on June 30<sup>th</sup>. The Birds would be up by a game at the All Star break, 20 games over .500. Playing .604 baseball in the first half, the O's offense wilted in the second as they split their last 66 games, but stayed in striking distance of New York. The last day the Orioles staked a claim to first place was September 6<sup>th</sup> by one-half game. Their terrific start, followed by .500 baseball, was good enough to slide into the first Wild Card spot. A disappointing replay of the 2023 playoffs, the Birds were swept from the post-season, this time by the rejuvenated Kansas City Royals, 2-0, in a best-of-three series. Four Royals pitchers shut-out the O's in Game 1, while Game 2 was a 1-1 tie until K. C. scored a run in the sixth to win the game and the series. In the two games, the Orioles mustered only 11 hits for a .167 team batting average...Even with the leftfield/ left centerfield fence moved back, Baltimore was second in the American League with 235 homers. Power-plus came from Anthony Santander (44 HRs, 102 RBI). Gunnar Henderson, the prior season's Rookie of the Year, shunned any second year hex with 37 HRs and 92 RBI. Colton Cowser added 24 jacks and utility man Jordan Westburg tacked on 18. Catcher Adley Rutschman spent less time behind the plate, hitting less than expected, but still put 19 home runs and 79 RBI on the board. The Orioles #1 draft pick of 2022, Jackson Holliday, debuted in April, was returned to Triple AAA, then later recalled and settled in as the everyday second baseman. His first big league homer, a grand slam as part of a 10-4 win over Toronto, garnered him a lot of new fans...Acquired via a trade with Milwaukee in February, Corbin Burnes filled his #1 slot in the starting rotation superbly, going 15-9 while striking out 181. Second year starter Grayson Rodriguez produced yeoman's work with 13 victories and 130 K's.
