The Padres spent almost the entire schedule in second place of the NL West--a season they just could not chase down the Dodgers. Their 90+ wins meant a playoff spot for the third time in five years. Even a 43-20 record after the All Star break wasn't enough. Down seven games at the break, they came within two games after a win at Dodger Stadium, September 24<sup>th</sup>. The remaining two games of the series were Dodger victories, ending hopes for the division title. In the Wild Card round, the Padres swept by the Braves with L. A. looming ahead for a NLDS. The Dodgers took Game One, 7-5; however, the Padres blew out L. A. in Game Two, 10-2. Game Three was snatched by the Padres, 6-5. Dodger pitching overwhelmed San Diego in the final two games via shutouts; the Padres were held to just two hits in Game Five. In two starts, ace Dylan Cease gave up eight earned runs in five innings... The Padres were tied by the Diamondbacks for the best team batting in the majors: .263. Offensively, Manny Machado led a parade of four 20+ home run hitters with 29. He also led the ball club in RBI (105). Rookie of the Year runner-up Jackson Merrill added 24 jacks and 90 RBI. He flashed a ball-magnet in centerfield with 8 assists contributing to four double plays. Jurickson Profar, back for his second stint in San Diego, played everyday and walloped 24 home runs to go with 85 RBI. He led the team in runs scored (94). Fernando Tatis Jr. hit 21 home runs in 102 games... The pitching staff was in the good hands of Cease (14 wins, 224 K's) and Michael King (13 wins, 201 K's). Closer Robert Suarez's save total was fourth-best in the big leagues.
