The defending World Champions had a tough time all season long to repeat their sterling 2023 performance. To begin the year, the Rangers were back in the saddle as the first place ball club of the AL West for 41 calendar days, a streak which ended May 11th. They dropped to second from May 12th through June 19th before slipping to third June 21st only 7 ½ games out. The team rallied to a 2 ½ game deficit on July 25th following a win by Max Scherzer against the Royals, his second upon coming off a lengthy stay on the injured list dating back to back surgery at the end of '23 campaign. He was never really right when he did return, striking out 40 in nine starts. After that, the Rangers were 27-32 the rest of the season, never finding the momentum to hop back into the race. Jacob deGrom made three late season starts, none of which resulted in a decision. Kirby Yates ended the year seventh in the majors in saves. Nathan Eovaldi was the pitching staff's leader in wins (12) and strikeouts (166)...Injuries to key players off-and-on kept the team's advance in the standings in idle as well. Corey Seager, who appeared in 123 games, was the offensive leader with 30 home runs. He was tied by Marcus Semien (23 HRs) and impressive rookie Wyatt Langford (16 HRs) in RBI (74). Adolis Garcia drove home the most base runners (85) and hit 25 jacks.
