The Redbirds were in the midst of a consecutive 12-game winning streak (April 12th through the 24th) when they perched themselves atop the NL East through June 22nd. At the All Star recess, the Cardinals were in a tie for the top spot, but following the break, they had to battle the Phillies, Expos, and Pirates for the division lead. September 13th through the 15th, the Cardinals managed to take two of three from the Phillies in Philadelphia (both wins by shutout) to leap back into sole possession of first place until the season's end...Former Cardinals star Joe Torre, the manager of the Atlanta Braves and the NL West champions, were swept out of the NLCS after being outscored by St. Louis 17-5 and outhit 34-15. NLCS MVP Darrell Porter hit .556 in the series, including three doubles and five RBI to lead the offense. Bob Forsch had started the proceedings with a 7-0 three-hit complete game whitewashing of the Braves at Busch Memorial Stadium in Game One. He struck out six in the game...The World Series versus the Milwaukee Brewers commenced inauspiciously in St. Louis with a 10-0 blowout loss. The ball clubs scored a bunch of runs back-and-forth through the next four games until the Cards tied the Series 3-3 with a 13-1 victory at home. In Game Seven, the Redbirds were down 3-1 going to the last of the sixth, but went on to score five times (three in the 6th and two in the 8th) to clinch their first World Championship since 1967. Porter was named Series MVP...Leftfielder Lonnie Smith led the N. L. during the regular season with 120 runs scored and finished third in the majors in stolen bases. George Hendrick led the team with 19 jacks and 104 RBI. Forsch and Joaquin Andujar both won 15 ballgames. Closer Bruce Sutter paced the big leagues in saves. Andujar posted a 1.080 WHIP, third in MLB.
