A quickly aging ballclub, the Phillies rebounded nicely from their early exit of the N. L. playoffs the prior Fall. Position players averaged 31.1 years of age, the pitching staff, 31.9...The season did not start in an auspicious fashion--on June 1st they were hanging with the East Division leaders at 25-22, in fourth and 4 ½ games from first. Then they started to win games in bunches. They would consistently take two of every three-game series. An eight-game winning streak in the latter part of June vaulted them into a tie for first. With additional five- and four-game winning skeins later on in the second half of the year, they held the top spot alone (or tied) with the Cardinals up through, August 11th. Their biggest lead was three games, August 4th. The Redbirds won their season meetings, 11-7, the last match-up of the year, September 21st, but by then the Phils had dropped to second, 4 ½ games out...Michael Jack Schmidt drilled 35 homers and knocked in 87 runs to lead the ballclub. His .403 on-base percentage was the highest of big league hitters. A .949 OPS ranked him second. Gary Matthews followed "Schmitty" with 19 jacks and 83 RBI. "Bo" Diaz added 18 homers and 85 RBI...Thirty-seven-year-old Steve Carlton captured his FOURTH career Cy Young Award off a year in which he led the majors with 23 wins, 286 strikeouts, innings pitched and shutouts (6). He tied Toronto's Dave Stieb for the most complete games (19). Soft-tosser Mike Krukow won 13 ballgames.
