Skipper Craig Counsell, in his second year as manager of the Cubs, guided them to equal their best start to a season since the 2016 World Championship team. By the All Star break, the NL Central Division was their cubbyhole by one game. They completed 111 calendar days in the lead or tied for first. Nearly winning six out of every ten games in the year's first half, the momentum tailed off after July 27th, the last day they were tied for first. With a drop to second the next day, they rode out the second half with a 35-31 record. The Cubs also won an impressive 25 of 44 one-run games...Earning the Number One Wild Card position, they eliminated the Padres in a best-of-three series, two games to one, the Cubbies first post-season celebration since 2017. The Milwaukee Brewers, whom the Cubs trailed by five games at the end of the year, sent the ball club to an early winter snooze in a best-of-five Division Series. The Cubs won games three and four after the Brewers won the first two; however, Milwaukee, Counsell's former team, won Game Five 3-1 to move to the NLCS...The team hit a composite .249 with 223 home runs. Three players hit 31 or more: Michael Busch (34), Seiya Suzuki (32), and Pete Crow-Armstrong (31). Suzuki had the most RBI (103). Chicago swiped 161 bases. Most successful were Crow-Armstrong (35) and Nico Hoerner (29)...The pitching (3.79 ERA) was consistently good all year. Four double-digit winners dotted the staff: Matthew Boyd (14) complemented by Colin Rea, Jameson Taillon, and Cade Horton who each won eleven. Boyd rang-up the most strikeouts (154). Horton was second in Rookie of the Year voting.
