The Texas Rangers were riding high, wide, and mighty after winning a World Championship under Bruce Bochy in 2023. Considered one of the top managers in the game, Bochy had been a seemingly natural choice to guide the franchise after many years of disappointment and disillusion. The magic wore off a bit in 2024. The 2025 season would be no different. The big plans for the return of the ball club to the post-season were dashed early on. Following the All Star break, which showed the Rangers in third but 8 ½ games out of first, the team started playing better. By the end of July, Texas was 5 ½ games out, completing the month with 16 wins. The team played .500 ball in September, enough to get them within striking distance of a Wild Card Spot as the ball club got as close as two games from first and a playoff position looking possible—with a bit of luck. Their lucky stars ended when they dropped 11 of their last 13 games to end the season...The Rangers didn't hit for average (.234), but they came out of the corral with a lot of firepower. Nine individuals hit at least 10 homers. Wyatt Langford hit 22, topping the list. Corey Seager was just one behind. Adolis Garcia knocked 19 out of the park and finished with the most RBI (75)...Number One starter Jacob deGrom avoided injury, winning 12 games and whiffing 185 for a full healthy season. Nathan Eovaldi won 11 times and posted a sub 2.00 ERA. Phenom Jack Leiter came through with a season of ten victories and 148 K's...Bochy won his 2,195th game as a manager May 15th to pass "Sparky" Anderson. With whispers of retirement starting in June, the Rangers brass sent him home after the season to seek a new direction for the franchise.
