****The Rockies concluded a season during which they set records of the embarrassing kind. After the first 50 games they were 8-42, the worst start to a year in the modern era. Along with setting a record for the fewest wins at the end of May (9), they eclipsed another dubious mark with the most losses before the All Star break (74), succeeding the White Sox's 71 of 2024. They were eliminated from any type of post-season August 23rd. Despite their third straight 100-loss campaign, the Rockies did manage to finish with a better record than the hapless White Sox of 2024 who had won 41 games. A -424 difference in runs allowed as opposed to runs scored, also set a modern day record..The Rock Pile did furnish some bright spots. How about the sudden emergence of converted catcher Hunter Goodman with a team high 31 homers and 91 RBI. Previously light-hitting Mickey Moniak was right behind with 24 home runs and 68 RBI. Brenton Doyle (15 HRs, 57 RBI) covered centerfield as well as anyone in baseball..The pitching staff was a whole other matter. It yielded just under six earned runs per game. Tanner Gordon won six games to lead(?) the staff while its best starter, Kyle Freeland, suffered 77 losses. He won five...Bud Black, who started his ninth season as manager, was mercifully let go May 11th and replaced with his third base coach, Warren Schaeffer. Schaeffer was given the nod to maintain the manager's office for 2026.****
