As recently as 2022, the Tigers were a 96-game losing team. That was A. J. Hinch's first year as manager. Coming off a 2024 season in the playoffs, the Tigers came out growling, rampaging out of the gate in '25. By the All Star break, the Tigers boasted an 11 ½ game lead in the AL Central Division, 21 games over .500. The second half started well, too, but by September 3<sup>rd</sup>, their lead had shrunk to ten games. After that point, the season started to unravel. A 6-15 record, including the loss of five of six games to the streaking Cleveland Guardians in the year's final month, left Detroit scrambling to reach the post-season. Cleveland had once trailed the Tigers by 15 ½ games mid-season (July 8<sup>th</sup>). The Guardians started to slide as well; however, they won a 9-8 walk off game in 10-innings while the Tigers lost at Boston the last day of the season...The division foes met once again in an AL Wild Card Series, but this time in a best-of-three, all at Cleveland, Detroit won two games. The Mariners and Tigers opposed one another in a best-of-five AL Division Series, which went five games. Seattle prevailed in Game 5, a marathon decided in 15 innings. Tommy Kahnle surrendered a one-out bases loaded single to end the season for Detroit...The Tigers hit lots of homers, the most by Riley Greene (36) along with Spencer Torkelson (31) and Kerry Carpenter (26). Greene finished with 111 RBI...Cy Young Award winner Tarik Skubal concluded the regular season with 13 wins and the league's lowest ERA. A WHIP of .891 was the best in baseball. He wound up 1-1 in the playoffs. Casey Mize won 14 ballgames. Jack Flaherty was a disappointing 8-15 W/L.
