****If anything, the Brewers were contenders throughout the season. Bobbing up and down from second to third place early in the year, the Brew Crew would be 6 ½ games behind the Cubs on June 17th. From that point on, they accelerated through the rest of the schedule, playing blistering .659 baseball (58-30), thereby flying past the Cubs in the NL Central Division. Chicago did tie them for first as late as July 27th; however, the lead remained with Milwaukee the rest of the way starting the next day. A 14-game straight winning streak, August 1st through the 16th, cemented their lead to nine games...The Brewers could hit (.258) and pitch (3.59 ERA), close to the best in MLB. A healthy Christian Yelich led the team in homers (29) and RBI (103). Phenom Jackson Chourio was next with 21 round-trippers. He drove in 78 mates. Brice Turang had a monster campaign, slamming 18 homers, driving in 81...Freddy Peralta finished fifth in Cy Young Award Voting with a sparkling 17-6 record (most wins in the N. L.) and 204 strikeouts. Rookie Jacob Misorowski took the majors by storm in his first few starts, appearing nearly unhittable. In 14 starts overall, he was 5-3 and struck out 87...The season looked more promising after the Brewers knocked out those pesky Cubs in five games of their NLDS. Misorowski won the clincher at home, 3-1...The NLCS was a major let down. The Dodgers swept the Brewers in four games, outscoring Milwaukee, 15-4. The Brewers mustered only 14 hits for a .118 batting average.****
