The Giants rounded out the first half of the season with a winning record, 52-45, ranked third in the NL West Division, six games out of first. The high point of the year came on June 13th, 12 games over .500 and tied for first. The second half of the year was not as pretty: 29 wins in 65 games. The Giants were no strangers to some turbulence on the field. On June 15th, they traded four players to Boston for third baseman/designated hitter Rafael Devers. He arrived at Oracle Park without a position--it would not be third base. His fielding skills at the hot corner had declined in recent years. His hitting was a disappointment as well after he was inserted as the designated hitter. With third-sacker Matt Chapman one of the best defensively in the big leagues, the Giants, to get Devers' power bat in the line-up, proceeded to try him out at first base. At the start, it was a nightmare, but the experiment continued. As a Giant, Devers hit 20 homers and drove in 51 runs. Willy Adames led the ball club in home runs (30) and RBI (87). Chapman and Heliot Ramos both banged-out 21 jacks...Number One starter Logan Webb won 15 ballgames while pitching the most innings in the majors. His 224 strikeouts placed him third. The dependable Robbie Ray did yeoman's work behind Webb, posting 11 wins and 186 K's...At the trade deadline, Mike Yastrzemski was traded to Kansas City. Tyler Rogers was also dealt to the Mets for three players, including highly regarded prospect Drew Gilbert, an outfielder to take Yaz's place...Disenchanted with the work manager Bob Melvin had done over two seasons--161-163 record resulting in losing campaigns in eight of nine years--he was let go by President of Baseball Operations Buster Posey...The loss of Blake Snell, 2024 Cy Young Award winner, to free-agency prior to the season, could not be reproduced.
