The signing of free agent outfielder Juan Soto to the biggest contract in MLB history wasn't enough to catapult the Mets to the World Series. As it turned out, the 64th season for the Mets in Flushing started off in earnest with high hopes for the future. By June 12th, the ball club had the best record in baseball at 45-24 and seemed to be on their way. The remaining 93 contests concluded with only 38 wins and three individual losing skeins of seven games or more. No post-season to be had...Soto played a shaky right field, but his powerful bat accounted for 43 homers and 105 RBI. He scored 120 runs and led the majors with 127 walks. His .396 OBP and 38 stolen bases were tops in the NL. Pete Alonso put up great numbers as well: 38 home runs, 126 RBI. Francisco Lindor added 21 homers, 86 RBI. Brandon Nimmo was good for 25 jacks and 92 RBI...The pitching was a sore spot. David Peterson (9 wins) and former Yankee Clay Holmes (12 W's) were inconsistent as starters. Kodai Senga returned from injury, pitched very well, then was horrible in the latter half of the year. Three of the Mets top pitching prospects were summoned from the minors. Nolan McLean, Brandon Sproat, and Jonah Tong won seven games in 17 starts combined. The trio compiled 96 strikeouts with a 3.92 ERA in 87.1 innings. McLean, alone, was 5-1 in wins/losses. Closer Edwin Diaz was off-and-on (usually on). He finished with 28 saves, 98 K's, and an ERA well below 2.00. Sean Manaea and Frankie Montas were huge disappointments.
