During the winter 2024-25, Red Sox General Manager Craig Breslow sought to shore up the infield defense and add another power right-hand bat to the lineup. It took awhile, but just at the start of Spring Training, Breslow and former Astros third baseman Alex Bregman agreed to a three-year free-agent deal for \$115 million, including a \$5 million signing bonus. Immediately, Rafael Devers, the reigning third baseman, let it be known he would not accept a full-time designated hitter job. He wanted to remain in the field at third. A proposal for a try-out at first base sent more sparks flying. In the end, the Red Sox went separate ways with the enigmatic Devers, delivering him to the San Francisco Giants on June 15<sup>th</sup>. His "deliverance" sent four players to Boston, two of which were minor leaguers. Before his departure, as DH, Devers had hit 15 homers with 58 RBI. With the Red Sox floundering in fourth place of the AL East Division, 8 ½ games out of first, outfielder Roman Anthony was summoned from Triple A Pawtucket. He debuted June 9<sup>th</sup>, going hitless in four at bats and picked up a fielder's choice RBI. The following day, the much-ballyhooed Anthony struck his first major league hit, a two run double. His first career homer came June 16<sup>th</sup>. Ecstatic with his projected high-level talent, the Bosox inked him to an eight-year \$130 million contract, August 6<sup>th</sup>. Selected Rookie of the Month for August, Anthony received his laurels after clouting six home runs, driving in 13 and scoring 21 runs. He hit .304 with an impressive .390 on-base percentage and .520 slugging percentage. He wound up third in league Rookie of the Year voting. A second highly-regarded Red Sox farmhand, Marcelo Mayer, a third baseman, had already debuted in May. In 44 games, he hit four home runs with 10 RBI. A healthy Trevor Story played 157 games, enough to lead the team with 25 homers and 96 RBI. Jarren Duran led the league in triples (13). At times, starter Garrett Crochet was nearly unhittable. He won 18 ballgames, leading the majors with 255 strikeouts while finishing second in Cy Young Award balloting. Brayan Bello, acquired in the Devers exchange, won 11 games. Closer Aroldis Chapman allowed eight earned runs all season and whiffed 85 batters. From June to the end of the year, aided by a 10-game winning streak in July, the Red Sox won 61 of 102 games (.598) to garner the second Wild Card spot in the post-season. The Yankees dumped the Bosox from the playoffs two games to one.
