The Reds did their darnedest to make the post-season for the fifth time in sixteen years and the first for new skipper Terry Francona in his 24<sup>th</sup> overall in the dugout. It was a struggle, but doggone it they made it! The All Star recess found them in fourth place, 7 ½ games out of the NL Central division lead, three games over .500. They skipped into third place for the rest of the year with a win the first game after the break. A flurry of trades and acquisitions occurred during the regular season, two of which brought Ke'Bryan Hayes from the Pirates and pitcher Zack Littell from Tampa Bay. Both fit in nicely--Hayes becoming the everyday third baseman, Littell supplementing the starting rotation. Redleg bats were loud throughout the year. Elly De La Cruz may not have reached heights many anticipated, but he spoke the loudest with 22 homers and 86 RBI, appearing in every game. Spencer Steer followed with 21 circuit clouts and 75 RBI...Newcomer and Number One starter Brady Singer won 14 ballgames to lead a starting staff with two additional double-digit winners: Nick Martinez (11) and lefty Andrew Abbott (10). The staff ERA was a respectable 3.86...The Dodgers, World Series bound, K-Oed the Reds from the playoffs, 2-0, in a best-of-three Wild Card Series.
