

# THE OLYMPIC GAMES

This is a quick simulation dice game that will allow you to recreate an Olympics based on the historical strengths of countries. This introductory set includes only a sampling of sports. The final version will include charts for every event every hosted during an Olympics.

## Equipment Needed

- Results Charts (Provided)
- Reference Charts (Provided)
- 2 Ten sided die, preferably different colors (Not Provided)
- Pen and Paper (Not Provided)

## Gameplay

Events are decided by rolling to determine the Gold, Silver, and Bronze medal winners. Only countries that have medaled in a previous Olympics are eligible in each event. The two ten sided die are rolled simultaneously and the player decides before starting which die is Die 1 and which die is Die 2. Die 1 is used for the left hand side of each chart and Die 2 is used to read along the top of each chart. If the result of the first roll is an "X", a second roll is required on the X Chart for that event. Most events will be determined in three rolls, but multiple rolls may be required for some events.

1. Roll dice to determine the Gold Medal winner. If the result is an "X", consult the X chart and roll again.
2. Roll dice to determine the Silver Medal winner. If the result is an "X", consult the X chart and roll again. For team sports, the Silver medal winner cannot be the same as the Gold medal winner. If this is the case, roll again.
3. Roll die to determine the Bronze Medal winner. If the result is an "X", consult the X chart and roll again. For team sports, the Bronze medal winner cannot be the same as the Gold or Silver medal winners. If this is the case, roll again.
4. Once the medal winners have been determined, the event is over. Add medal totals to each countries total and proceed to the next event.

## Reference Charts

The **Nation Reference Chart** can be used to familiarize oneself with the 3-letter code being used for each nation on the Result Charts.

The **Event Reference Chart** can be used for simulating historical Olympics. Only a handful of events have been contested at each and every Olympic Games. This chart will enable you to know which events to contest at which games.
